 The Pre-Arrival Clearance Procedure has been introduced since 1st October 2019 for high compliant as pilot stage. So far, there has been only 257 SADs using this procedure, due to the lack of advanced information exchange. Under the DGMT project, Tradelens is connected with ASYCUDA through ASYHUB. However, the advance cargo manifest information received is not suitable for the PAP. Currently, the GDCE is working on the connection b/w ASYCUDA and UPU/CDS 	 EU/ARISE Plus Cambodia is assiting the GDCE on the DGMT and DGT Project on Maritime cargo Swisscontact/Global Alliance for Trade Facilitation is working with the GDCE on the linkage b/w ASYCUDA and UPU/CDS for the information exchange on postal items.
