Background



- TFAF was set up to address concerns over accessibility and the delivery of TFA targeted assistance and capacity building
- Report on the situation from TFAF perspectives
- Scope is accessibility of targeted TFA assistance and capacity building.
- Objective is to enhance transparency and support the Committee in implementing the TFA.

Methodology: Data sources





- Information sources
 - Article 22 notifications from Members + detailed information, where available
 - Members' category C notifications
 - Members' and Partners Article 16 notifications
 - Members' voluntary early implementation notifications
 - TFAF Members' requests for support
- Limitations
 - Incomplete and imperfect picture
 - Financial Assistance not reported (IADB; WBG particularly relevant for 10.4)


Observations: Accessibility





- Maximum number: 10 resources per Member
- Average: 2,7 resources per Member
- Concentration
 - Some Members have access to few or no partners for TFA
 - 'Champions' (7-10 resources)
 - 4 with zero resources identified in this data data

TACB resources per Members



Observations: Accessibility



- Unequal.
 - Few champions
 - Majority 1-3 partners
- Support also goes to non-Members and Members in Accession
- No linkage between notification and accessibility observed
 - Category C measures
 - Article 16 notifications (TA needs and TA arrangement progress)
- Caution: TA arrangement and progress
 - Only 40 members reported in total
 - Only 18 LDCs

Observations: Accessibility





- Testing factor: Geography
 - Linkage with language and geography observed
 - Two groups are below average
 - French-speaking African Members, particularly LDCs (average resources 2)
 - Spanish-speaking Central & South American Members also appear under-served – so is language a main barrier?
 - A few programs / partners have a critical role in these Members
 - French-speaking African Members: TFWA, Belgium

Take aways



- 1. Leave-no one behind is important
- 2. Leave no measure behind is also important
- 3. Orchestration between donors is necessary
- 4. Risk of TACB being pulled away from TFA targeted to related issues
- 5. TFA integration into bilateral, regional projects as important as sectoral programs
- 6. Silver bullet solutions versus tailor-made innovative solutions.
